## **Description**

This lecture examines the history of public health from its early inceptions to modern day political and public health controversies.

## **Speaker Biography**

Dr. Ellen Amster's research engages histories of medicine and public health, especially global health, traditional healing, women's histories, and imperialism. From her 2013 book, *Medicine and the Saints: Science, Islam, and the Colonial Encounter in Morocco, 1877-1956* (Arabic Translation UIR 2024), she developed a global health study abroad program and a CIHR-funded Morocco-Canada network in maternal and infant health. She is currently working on a project tentatively entitled "Colonial Drag: Transvestism, Hybridity, and Cosmopolitan Identities in Colonial and Post-Colonial French Empire."

For everyone to enjoy, she developed the *Hannah History of Medicine and Medical Humanities Research Portal*, with hundreds of libraries, archives, museums, digital collections, and grants, to browse for research and fun. It includes public health records for Hamilton, which are conserved at HPL.
